Assessment:

- The Assessment part of **RED e-Learning** is split into four sections; Driving History, Knowledge, Attitude and Skill.
- Each section takes 5-10 minutes to complete. You do not have to do them all in one sitting, however you cannot partially complete a section and return to it later. As you complete each section, the padlock will close, and a green tick will appear.
- Each section has been designed to test your practical and theoretical knowledge as well as to expand your driving knowledge and understanding.

Knowledge:

This assessment has been designed to test your ability to spot road situations and hazards developing.

You will be shown 10 video clips, watch each one carefully and imagine you are the driver. When the video stops answer the question.

There is no time limit on this assessment and it will not take long to complete.

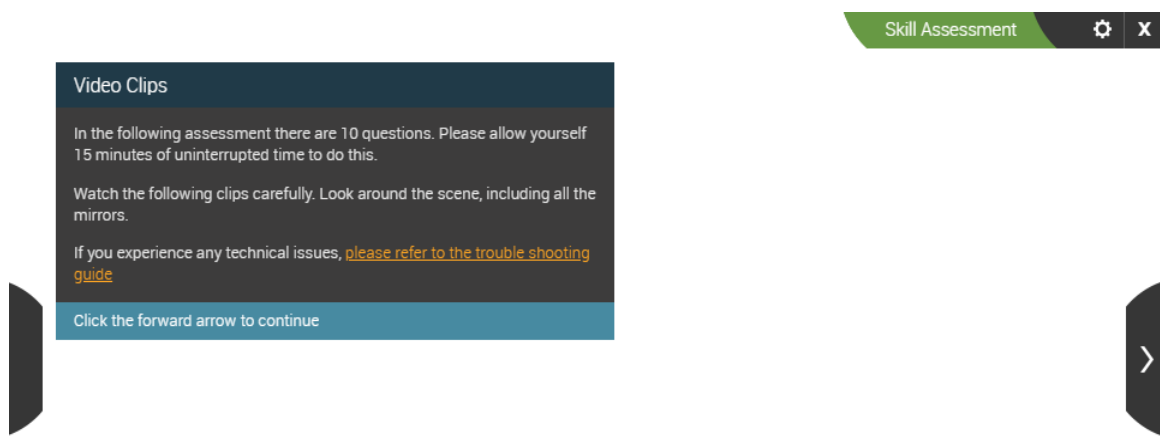
Answer ALL the questions in one sitting as your progress will not be saved.

We recommend you [Practice the Skill Module](#) before you proceed to the full assessment. **Make sure you have audio switched on.**

Make sure you have audio switched on and when ready click the continue button to get started.



- To begin the clips, click the 'next' arrow in the top right of the screen.



- How you do in the assessment will directly affect the training you receive, so take your time and answer the questions as accurately as possible.
- The assessment does not take very long and it does not save your progress so answer all the questions in one sitting.

Completing the Skill Section:

- An instruction at the beginning of each video will instruct you on what to do. The video clips vary and can differ in what action you are required to take. When you are ready, click 'Start'.



- In this section the clips are interactive and the vehicle will move to resemble a real journey so concentrate on the moving images to answer the question correctly.

Eye Scanning:

- In the Eye Scanning section, you will be given questions with multiple answer options. Depending on what happened in the clip you will be asked to choose the correct answer.



- When you have answered the question, you will be given the choice to go to the next video or review the current one again.



Hazzard Detection:

- In the Hazard section, questions will ask you to locate specific hazards on the screen.
- Watch the clip carefully, and when the video stops click on each hazard that you see.
- Orange circles will appear as you identify the hazards.



- Click '**continue**' to see your feedback.


Training:


- The system will decide how much further training is required. You may be asked to complete up to 19 online remedial training modules, covering a variety of topics.
- To access your training modules, click 'launch'.
